

# FACT SHEET

## 655<sup>th</sup> Intelligence, Surveillance and Reconnaissance Wing

The 655<sup>th</sup> Intelligence, Surveillance and Reconnaissance (ISR) Wing is an independent wing under the 10<sup>th</sup> Air Force, Air Force Reserve Command. Headquartered at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio. The unit stood up as Detachment 2, 10<sup>th</sup> Air Force October 1, 2012. On September 28, 2013, the unit was officially activated and re-designated the 655<sup>th</sup> ISR Group and official became a wing September 20, 2018. The wing consists of two groups and 14 classic associate unit intelligence squadrons across seven different states conducting 10 distinct missions.



### Mission

The 655<sup>th</sup> ISR Wing ensures the training and readiness of Air Force Reserve Command intelligence squadrons engaged in highly technical, diverse, and complex Intelligence, Surveillance, and Reconnaissance mission sets.

### Personnel

The unit consists of more than 1,200 Air Force Reserve and Department of the Air Force civilian personnel spanning more than a dozen Air Force specialties.

### Organization

The 655<sup>th</sup> ISR Wing is the headquarters and is co-located with the 655<sup>th</sup> ISR Group and three squadrons at Wright-Patterson AFB, Ohio: the 64<sup>th</sup> Intelligence Squadron, responsible for human intelligence collection, the 71<sup>st</sup> Intelligence Squadron, responsible geospatial and measurement and signatures intelligence analysis, and the 14<sup>th</sup> Intelligence Squadron, which provides intelligence support to Air Force acquisitions. The 755<sup>th</sup> ISR Group and three squadrons are located at Joint Base Langley-Eustis, Virginia: the 42<sup>nd</sup> Intelligence Squadron, responsible for targeting intelligence; and the 63<sup>rd</sup> and 718<sup>th</sup> Intelligence Squadrons, responsible for multi-discipline Distributed Common Ground System (DCGS) ISR operations. Beale Air Force Base, California, is home to the 38<sup>th</sup> and 50<sup>th</sup> Intelligence Squadrons, responsible for multi-discipline Distributed Common Ground System ISR operations. Offutt Air Force Base, Nebraska is home to the 49<sup>th</sup> Intelligence Squadron, responsible for crypto linguistic intelligence support, and the 820<sup>th</sup> Intelligence Squadron, responsible for targeting intelligence. Ft Meade, Maryland is home of the 16<sup>th</sup> Intelligence Squadron, responsible for conducting signals intelligence, and the 512<sup>th</sup> Intelligence Squadron providing cyber ISR. The 28<sup>th</sup> Intelligence Squadron is located at Hurlburt Field, Florida, and is responsible for ISR support to Special Operations Forces. Finally, the 23<sup>rd</sup> Intelligence Squadron is located at Joint Base San Antonio, Texas, and provides cyber ISR support.
